What is a Kiwanis?

Pewaukee Kiwanis is a group of men and women that works to improve the lives of others, especially children. Kiwanis does this in two ways: raising money to benefit deserving organizations, some of them are listed inside; and hands-on projects like cleaning the Pewaukee River, playing bingo and Christmas caroling at River Hills senior center.

Kiwanis International

Kiwanis is also a global organization with over 280,000 members worldwide. Our global project continues to be the elimination of Iodine Deficiency Disorder (IDD). This disease is a leading cause of preventable mental and physical retardation, especially in children.

Over the past 12 years Kiwanis has raised over 75 million dollars towards that goal. IDD projects have been funded in conjunction with UNICEF in 95 countries.

Who are our members?

Kiwanis is open to adult men and women who have the desire and ability to help us achieve these goals. There are many opportunities to work on behalf of our club. By working with other Kiwanis members lasting friendships are made.

A partial list of local organizations supported by the Pewaukee Kiwanis:

The Pewaukee Library – We have donated \$10,000 towards the children's area in our new library. We continue to support the library each year.

The Pewaukee Food Pantry – We continue to increase our support of the Food Pantry annually. We have donation boxes in several local businesses that collect money year-round.

Pewaukee Historical Society – We annually support the Historical Society. We recently donated to their barn-building project which is currently under construction.

Tyme Out Youth Center in Stone Bank - We donate summertime camperships so children that may not otherwise be able to attend can do so. Letters received from kids thanked the Kiwanis “for the best week of their lives!”

Other Kiwanis Activities:

- Our club members participate annually in a Spelling Bee to benefit the Waukesha Literacy Council.
- Club members build a scarecrow each fall which is displayed downtown. Scarecrows line the streets in preparation for the annual Halloween parade and trick or treat. Kiwanis members also make caramel apple sundaes to give away to all the trick or treaters, moms and dads.

- Club members hand out cookies to young and old alike at the Pewaukee Historical Society's Annual Christmas Tree Lighting. Cookies are baked by members, spouses or hastily purchased during this busy season. If you like to bake, give us a call.
- Each December, Kiwanis members don Santa hats and Christmas carol at River Hills West and Heartland Senior Centers. Afterwards, we enjoy the season and each other's company with a Christmas dinner at a fine local restaurant.

Pewaukee Kiwanis Fundraisers:

The Pewaukee River Run – Our annual canoe and kayak race down the Pewaukee River ends at Frame Park, Waukesha. The 6 mile race takes place, as it has for the last 35 years, on the last Saturday in April. Borrow a canoe and join the fun!

Pewaukee Beach Party – A 2-day event on Pewaukee's lakefront is held the 4th weekend in June. Music, food, volleyball tournament, ski show, kid's entertainment and a beer tent all make it the “Best Little Beach Party in Waukesha County”.
